



# Well-Child Visits in the First 30 Months of Life (W30)

HEDIS® Measurement Year 2024

**Measure Description:** The percentage of members who turned 15 or 30 months old during the measurement year and had the following number of well-child visits with a PCP on different dates of service:

1. **Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months:** children who turn 15 months with six or more well-child visits on or before the 15-month birthday.
2. **Well-Child Visits Age 15 Months-30 Months:** children who turn 30 months with two or more well-child visits between the 15-month birthday plus 1 day and the 30-month birthday.

## Eligible Population

Members who turned 15 or 30 months old during the measurement year.

## Product Lines

Commercial, Medicaid

## Data Collection Method

Administrative (claims), Supplemental data

## Exclusions

Members are excluded from the measure if they meet the following criteria:

- Members who are in hospice.

## Measure Compliance (numerator)

### **Numerator 1** – Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months

Six or more well-child visits on different dates of service on or before the 15-month birthday.

### **Numerator 2** – Well-Child Visits for Age 15 Months-30 Months

Two or more well-child between the 15-month birthday plus 1 day and the 30-month birthday.

The well-child visit must occur with a PCP type practitioner, but the PCP does not have to be the practitioner assigned to the child.

Preventive services may be rendered on visits other than well-child visits. Well-child preventive services count toward the measure, regardless of the primary intent of the visit.

Examples of a comprehensive well-child visit includes a health history, physical exam, physical and mental developmental history, and anticipatory guidance.



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## Measure Compliance (numerator), continued

It is recommended that well-child visits follow the American Academy of Pediatrics' Bright Futures Periodicity Schedule:

- Newborn
- First Week (3 to 5 day)
- 1 month
- 2 months
- 4 months
- 6 months
- 9 months
- 12 months
- 15 months
- 18 months
- 24 months (2 year)
- 30 months (2 1/2 year)
