



Eye Exam for Patients with Diabetes (EED)

HEDIS® Measurement Year 2023

Measure Description: The percentage of members 18-75 years of age with a diagnosis of diabetes (Type 1 and Type 2) who had a retinal eye exam.

Eligible Population

- Members 18-75 years of age with a diagnosis of diabetes (Type 1 and 2).
- Members who are in hospice or palliative care are excluded from the eligible population.

Member Compliance (numerator) Diabetic Retinal Exam

Screening or monitoring for diabetic retinal disease as identified by one of the following exams performed in the measurement year or the year prior to the measurement year.

- Retinal or dilated eye exam must be performed by an eye care professional (optometrist or ophthalmologist) in the measurement year.
- A **negative** retinal or dilated eye exam (negative for retinopathy) by an eye care professional in the year prior to the measurement year.
- Bilateral eye enucleation any time during the member's history through Dec. 31 of the measurement year.

Code Type	Codes	Description
CPT-CAT-II	2022F, 2024F, 2026F	Eye exam <i>with</i> evidence of retinopathy
CPT-CAT-II	2023F, 2025F, 2033F	Eye exam <i>without</i> evidence of retinopathy
CPT-CAT-II	3072F	Low Risk of Retinopathy (no evidence in the prior year)

Hybrid Measure Note:

The EED measure is hybrid. Any care not received via claims during the measurement year will result in medical record requests during the HEDIS medical record review project



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Exclusions

Members are excluded from the measure if they meet the following criteria:

- Members 66 years of age and older as of December 31 of the measurement year who have both a frailty and an advanced illness diagnosis.
- Members with a diagnosis of polycystic ovarian syndrome, gestational diabetes or steroid induced diabetes during the measurement year or the year prior to the measurement year and do not have a diagnosis of diabetes during the measurement year or the year prior to the measurement year.

Please Note: Blindness is not an exclusion
